

Mayor encourages communities to adhere to Lockdown regulations



SENQU UPDATE





INSTALLATION OF WATER TANKS IN SENQU

South Africa is a water scarce country but notwithstanding the reality, Joe Gqabi District Municipality (JGDM) has managed to deliver 231 water tanks and water trucks from the 5th of May 2020 to the local municipalities as part of the donation from the Department of Water and Sanitation as well as other private donors.

This gesture of goodwill has significantly come at the time of need to fight the COVID-19 pandemic to enable the residents to wash their hands frequently.

The District received a total of 231 tanks from three institutions and in collaboration with the Councils of the two local municipalities, determined the ward distribution and location of the Jojo tanks for submission to the service provider installation. The number of the water tanks installed in Senqu is 100 all together and 5 water trucks have been allocated in various wards for the distribution of water.

The following wards received water tanks and are being allocated water trucks:

- Ward 1 (15 villages)
- Ward 5 (9 villages)
- * Wards 6,7,8,9 and 13 have received a water tank,
- * Ward 17 (5 villages) in Sterkspruit.
- Senqu Municipality has availed its own water carting truck to the district to be used for the filling of the Jojo tanks / water tanks.



In order to contain the spread of COVID-19 one of the safety measures is to wash your hands more frequently and the municipality has prioritized water and made water tanks available in different wards. The municipality is making a clarion call to communities to heed the message of the President. It is all in our hands to defeat the virus. In conclusion, the mayor has said that the lifestyle of each person is the best weapon against the pandemic.





MEC of Transport Weziwe Tikana-Gxothiwe launched a disinfection campaign at the taxi rank and In support of the initiative ,the mayor together with department of Transport embarked on a disinfecting campaign of taxis and sensitizing the taxi operators on transport regulations:

Road based public transport services are permitted to operate from 05:00 until 19:00 with a grace period of one hour in the afternoon .

No person is allowed to use public transport without wearing a mask

Loading capacity for minibus taxis remains at 70% passengers.

Travel between provinces, metropolitan areas and districts is prohibited.

Workers who have to commute between the areas on a daily basis, attendance of funerals and transportation of mortal remains will be exempted from this.



Maintaining social distance in pay points

The standard recommendation to curb the spread of the covid-19 includes frequent washing of hands with an alcohol based hand sanitizer, hand rub or soap and water. covering your nose and mouth and avoiding close contact with anyone.

The Municipal employees took it upon themselves to the process runs smoothly by ensuring social distance is

maintained In SASSA grant payment queues by placing chairs in between the people. Social distancing or simply put physical distancing is the best ammunition against the spread of the virus. It cost no money.
