No faxed or emailed documents will be accepted. The Senqu Municipality does not bind itself to accept the lowest tender or any other tender and reserves the right to accept the whole or part of the tender. Tenders will be opened in public as soon as practical after the closing time.

Documents will be available on the municipal the website http://www.senqu.gov.za.

Tenderers must print the document and bring to clarification meeting. Joint ventures must ensure that all contracting parties must attend on behalf of their respective company for their bid to be considered responsive.

Tender enquiries can be made to the parties as stated above. A clarification meeting as stated above will be held on the date and time at the venue stated above.

(NB) Bids will be evaluated on the 80/20 principle and according to the risk matrix as per CIBD Practise Note 5.

Tenders must be compliant with all bid requirements stated in the tender document. Tenderers must bind the document in a manner so that it does not fall apart. Bidders are specifically referred to the requirements of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022, including but not limited to pre-qualification criteria, functionality, eligibility, statutory, local content, compulsory sub-contracting, other objective, and price and



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preference criteria as stated in the tender document. If applicable, only locally produced, or manufactured goods meeting the stipulated minimum threshold for local production and content, will be considered. Tenderers' attention is drawn to the registration requirements in the tender documents in respect of registration on the municipal supplier database, Central Suppliers' Database, Construction Industry Development Board (if applicable), etc.

Local content:

- •Steel products with a stipulated minimum threshold of 100% and HDPE pipes of 100 % plastic local production and content will be considered.
- •The exchange rate to be used for the calculation of local production and content must be the exchange rate published by the South African Reserve Bank (SARB) at 12:00 on the date of advertisement of the bid; and
- •Only the South African Bureau of Standards (SABS) approved technical specification number SATS 1286: 2017 must be used to calculate local content.
